

Campaign Mission

The SILICON VALLEY CAMPAIGN FOR LEGAL SERVICES (SVCLS) provides funds to increase the effectiveness and ability of non-profit legal services agencies to assist men, women and children of all ages, ethnicities and cultural backgrounds. The organization supports individuals who cannot afford to hire an attorney in civil cases and whose legal rights would otherwise go unrecognized and/or unenforced. Funds raised from the legal community in Silicon Valley and from surrounding areas are distributed to agencies that provide civil legal services directly to the poor. SVCLS also works to encourage the legal community to become more involved in the provision of pro bono legal assistance. The Silicon Valley Campaign for Legal Services is a recipient of the American Bar Association's prestigious Harrison Tweed award, with the Santa Clara County Bar Association, for leadership in expanding and developing support for the provision of free legal services to the poor.

Characteristics and Needs of People Who Benefit

Over 521,000 people in Silicon Valley—30% of the population—qualify for special help due to income, age or disability. These individuals' critical legal issues are primarily related to:

- \circ health care;
- the ability to secure and preserve affordable and fair housing;
- family law issues such as domestic violence, child custody and divorce;
- economic stability;
- special problems of the elderly;
- consumer fraud, debt collection abuses and other unfair practices;
- immigration; and
- employment.

The people who receive SVCLS assistance have "poverty level" incomes far below the amount actually needed to live in Silicon Valley. Many of these individuals are the working poor. For a family of three (such as a mother and two children) the federal poverty level is \$16,600/year – well below the Self-Sufficiency Standard for Santa Clara County of \$65,589. Many such families cannot afford even their basic needs without assistance.

Silicon Valley-based legal services agencies lack the financial resources needed to meet the legal needs of our community's poorest residents. We therefore need and welcome the legal community's pro bono actions and financial support.

For almost three decades, the Asian Law Alliance has provided indigent legal services on issues such as housing, domestic violence, immigration, and citizenship rights. Along with the other members of our Board, our thanks to all SVCLS supporters for helping us continue to make these services available to our clients."

Client Cases Inspire Our Action

Donors and beneficiary agencies joined together in celebration of the sixth annual SVCLS distribution of funds on October 19, 2005. Skadden Arps Slate Meagher & Flom LLP graciously hosted the event, which was attended by over 100 attorneys and supporters from the community.

Clients shared their meaningful, personal stories – including relating the circumstances that led them to seek legal assistance and acknowledging the impact of the legal assistance they received due to SVCLS funding. Here are just two of many client cases this year:

SARA SHARES HER STORY:

I worked two or three jobs at a time in order to provide for my children. Little by little I saved to buy a home for my family.

I was lucky to find a property I could afford and secured an affordable mortgage. Everything was going well until I went to the mortgage company to pay my monthly bill and a salesman proposed I refinance my property to save money. Instead of saving money, the loan almost cost my children and me our home.

The loan company took advantage of my inability to speak English well. They negotiated the terms of the loan in Spanish and lied in the English language documents. The mortgage lender also lied to me about the fees and interest rate and submitted false and forged documents to get approval for the loan. When the true cost of the loan was revealed to me, I could not pay the monthly charges and my home went into foreclosure.



I am happy to say that with the help of legal services lawyers, my children and I remain in our home. I want to thank these lawyers and urge you to support services that make it possible for low-income people to benefit from American justice.

WAN YING SHARES THIS STORY WITH US: When I sought help from a legal services agency, I was living in a domestic violence shelter and was hopeless about my future.

After we legally immigrated to the U.S. at the invitation of my son, my husband was diagnosed with Alzheimer's and became increasingly violent. My son

blamed me for my husband's condition and kicked me out of his home. I was in and out of hospitals and shelters for over six months. I did not speak English and knew nothing about America. I just went where my social worker told me to go, and applied for things she told me to apply for. I did not know my rights.




The California disability benefit program denied my claim for help. My case was appealed while I was staying at a shelter. I remember the anxiety and fear that would grip my heart every afternoon at 3 p.m. when they called out the names of the people who had won the lottery to stay in a bed that night.

My case was won on appeal. I am grateful to the legal services agency for helping me gain a sense of security, with a roof over my head and food on the table. I don't have to wait until three o'clock to find out if I will be safe tonight. From now on, I will be safe.

Thank you for helping people like me who have nowhere else to go, and who have nobody else who will help. Thank you for supporting the good that must be done.

Significant Results Achieved Due to Rise in Agency Awards

The grants given to eight legal service providers enable them to serve 23,000 low-income people. SVCLS awarded nearly \$379,226 to eight beneficiary agencies, up from \$336,846 in 2004, for an increase of nearly 13%. Each beneficiary agency's board of directors determines the best and most effective use of these monies, thus ensuring support for the most urgent client needs and program priorities. Organizations receive a proportional share of the funds raised.

Visibility and Interest Continue to Grow!

The campaign continues to garner statewide interest and recognition. Julie Emede, 2005 Chair of the Santa Clara County Bar Association, was invited to speak about pro bono services, and SVCLS in particular, before the California State Assembly's Judiciary Committee in November.

Thanks to a continued and generous advertising donation from *The Recorder*, and marketing communications support from Allison Blattel Professional Services Group, a division of Allison & Partners, SVCLS continues to challenge the legal community to increase its support of SVCLS. The "Ready. Set. Challenge!" advertising campaign also provides recognition for our donor family.

A feature story in the December 2005 edition of *Bay Area Lawyer Magazine* brought added and much welcome visibility, recounting SVCLS' history and highlighting the urgency and continued need to help our neighbors who lack the means or ability to protect their own interests.

We are grateful to everyone who has helped bring attention to increasing legal services for the poor through SVCLS.


